

## HOUSING

Last year in Oklahoma City, at least 23 homeless people died on the streets - no shelter, no food, no hope. **NSO is working to change that.**

NSO's Housing Programs serve mothers and their children, chronically homeless adults with mental illnesses, young men with nowhere else to go, and pregnant women and their babies.

Some clients need shelter for a few days or weeks. Some need a home and resources for a year or two while they work toward independence. Some need one-time help to avoid falling into the cycle of homelessness. Others need a safe, permanent home in a caring community.

**Last year, NSO helped 217 individuals in 75 families secure housing or remain in their current home through the Rental Assistance program.**

To foster success and improve programs, NSO has begun a "Keeping in Touch" program to provide ongoing care for former residents who have transitioned into permanent housing. This program helps measure long-term outcomes and provide any needed support.

### CAROLYN WILLIAMS CENTER

Thanks to community support, young men in Oklahoma City, ages 18-23, have NSO's Carolyn Williams Center (CWC). At CWC, they have a safe, clean home for up to 24 months while they gain the skills and resources they need to achieve independence. CWC also reserves space for a 90-day emergency shelter, ensuring that young men in the community won't need to sleep on the streets while they find a home.

When CWC opened in 2005, it was the first program serving this high-risk population in the region. Today, it serves as the model.

**In 2017, CWC provided temporary housing and support to 48 young men.**



## MARTHA'S HOUSE

*Homeless families, with at least one child, make up about 25 percent of Oklahoma City's homeless population.*

Women and their children become homeless for a variety of reasons. Sometimes they are leaving a domestic violence situation, with just their children and the clothes on their backs. Other times it's an illness or job loss that created a cycle of late payments, late fees and back rent - spiraling them into homelessness.

Martha's House is a seven-unit apartment building, where NSO provides these families with a safe, clean and fully furnished apartment home for up to 24 months. These highly-motivated moms work to gain the skills and resources they need to support their family independently, while NSO staff and volunteers stand alongside them to ensure their success.

**Martha's House provided housing for nine families in 2017, for a total of 34 individuals.**

## GATEWOOD

*About five percent of this community's homeless population are babies under age five.*

Gatewood has four efficiency apartments for women who are pregnant or have a baby. These families can live at Gatewood for up to 24 months, while the young moms gain the skills and resources they need to live independently.

## PALO DURO I & PALO DURO II

*In January 2017, 451 homeless people surveyed in Oklahoma City had severe mental illnesses. These precious people are far more likely to be victimized and die in the streets.*

NSO's commitment to housing adults with mental illnesses has helped reduce homelessness in this population by more than 10 percent over the last few years.

With a combined 36 units, Palo Duro I and II are apartment communities for single adults with mental illnesses. These programs represent permanent supportive housing - meaning clients can stay the rest of their lives (and many do), while receiving an appropriate level of supportive care. Turnover is low and the waiting list is long. Many residents consider NSO and their apartment community to be their family. Staff provide life-skills coaching, monitor health care access and coordinate events that build community and provide daily activity.

**In 2017, Palo Duro I and Palo Duro II were home to 47 residents.**

# Dental Clinic

## NSO DENTAL CLINIC


*A person's smile may be today's most obvious example of our society's divide between the "haves" and the "have nots." Infected or missing teeth, diseased gums and poor hygiene can be linked to unemployment, poor school performance and fatal diseases such as heart failure and stroke.*

**Last year, NSO's low-cost dental clinic provided more than 8,700 procedures including 1,500 preventative procedures, helping patients regain their smiles, their health and their confidence.**

The dental clinic facility, underwritten by Delta Dental of Oklahoma Foundation, is state-of-the-art and provides a full range of acute and preventative procedures at a fraction of the cost of private dental care.

**Also in 2017, 4,548 area school children and 3,860 adults received education, screening and referrals for dental care through NSO's Oral Health Outreach Program.**

NSO's Dental Clinic began an extern program with OU's College of Dentistry in 2016. Continuing in 2017, fourth year dental students come to the clinic and work alongside NSO dentists and hygienists. This valuable experience allows students to gain real-world experience while giving back to those in need. This partnership has allowed NSO to treat more patients and create a generation of dentists who can give back to their communities.

## WOMEN, INFANTS & CHILDREN CLINIC (WIC)

*A recent study examined 40 years' worth of data related to the federal WIC program and determined that children whose mothers participated in WIC while pregnant scored higher on assessments of mental development at age two than similar children whose mothers did not participate, and they later performed better on reading assessments while in school.*

NSO's WIC Clinic serves more women and babies with more services than any other program in Oklahoma! In fact, **NSO's WIC Clinic served more than 54,000 women and babies in 2017.**

Mothers come to the Clinic for nutrition counseling, lactation consultations and general education about nutrition and child development. NSO's WIC Clinic features benefits not found at most clinics:

- Two full-time Registered Dietitians (RD/LDs)
- Two full-time Certified Lactation Consultants
- A grant-funded breastfeeding peer mentorship program



WIC prenatal care benefits **REDUCE** the rate of low birthweight babies by **25%**





# DENTAL CLINIC



NSO operates a low-cost dental clinic, which provides affordable dental procedures and preventative care for individuals in the Oklahoma City and surrounding areas.

Our dental staff also participates regularly in outreach and education efforts in the community and local schools. These efforts include education and demonstration of proper dental hygiene, as well as free dental health and oral cancer screenings.

The NSO Dental Clinic has partnered with the University of Oklahoma School of Dentistry to create a new dental extern program within our clinic. Dental students from OU come and work alongside NSO's dentists and hygienist, which allows the students to give back to the community while gaining valuable, real-world experience.



Heather Wheeler, Dental Clinic Hygienist, saw 4,623 children and 5,528 adults in the Oklahoma City area through NSO's 2016 dental outreach program. Within this program, Heather performs free screenings, distributes oral hygiene kits and educates on the importance of oral health. Heather also does preventative dental care and performed 1,309 preventative procedures.

# WIC CLINIC

NSO maintains Oklahoma's largest Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Clinic to serve low-income and at-risk populations. This income-based program provides nutritional education, supplemental foods and assistance to mothers with infants.



Our clinic holds weekly breastfeeding classes, general nutrition classes, high-risk classes and lactation consultations. We also have a full-time nutritionist on staff.

# HOUSING

NSO operates three transitional housing programs and two permanent housing programs. Our residents are provided with a safe, healthy home, life skills classes and case management services. They each enjoy their own personal space as well as the strong community bond that exists among the residents. With NSO, they all have a family.

NSO also has a Continuum of Care program, where we follow our residents as they take their first step toward independent living.

NSO's Rental Assistance program helped 136 Oklahomans stay in their homes or find permanent housing in 2016.

**Martha's House** - Temporary, supportive housing for homeless mothers and their children.

**Gatewood** - Transitional living for homeless women who are pregnant or have one child under the age of five.

**Carolyn Williams Center** - A safe, supervised home for young men ages 18-23 who are homeless or who have aged out of foster care and have no place else to go.

**Palo Duro I & II** - Permanent supportive housing for homeless adults with a diagnosed mental illness.

**Continuum of Care** - Continued support as residents transition to independent living.

## Martha's House & Gatewood

Martha's House provides seven apartments for homeless mothers and their children. Families are welcomed into their fully-furnished apartment that immediately feels like home. Volunteers donate furniture, bedding, towels and everything else the family will need while living with NSO and to take with them after their stay.


This two-year life skills program helps women prepare for the transition into independent living. The mothers attend weekly meetings to learn valuable skills that they can carry with them all their lives. Residents must also be in school or employed full time to stay at Martha's House.

Gatewood provides four apartments for homeless pregnant mothers or homeless mothers with one child. Just like Martha's House, families are welcomed into a fully-furnished apartment and can stay with NSO for up to two years. These mothers also attend weekly life skills classes and must be in school or employed full time.

## Carolyn Williams Center & Continuum of Care

After graduating from Job Corps, Winfred felt scared and unprepared to transition into independent living. He found NSO's Carolyn Williams Center and decided it was the right program for him. The CWC helped him secure a job, get back on his feet and find direction in his life. With the help of NSO, Winfred has now transitioned into his own apartment through NSO's Continuum of Care program and is a CNA/CMA.



NSO's Carolyn Williams Center (CWC) is the only program of its kind in the entire region.

This dorm-style living program provides 18 beds for homeless young men, ages 18-23, for up to two years. Many of them come directly from foster care or youth shelters. During their stay, these young men receive help finishing school or finding jobs, take weekly life skills classes, share chores and learn how to live independently to ensure their future self-sufficiency.

The center also has an emergency shelter, where young men can stay up to 120 days.

The Continuum of Care program (COC) lets NSO follow our clients from the Carolyn Williams Center as they take the first steps into independent living. NSO helps them secure permanent housing and continues to provide support in any way they need.

In 2016, OKC Beautiful built a four-bed garden at the Carolyn Williams Center that provides fruits and vegetables year round for the residents who live there.






